### Report on the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone Financial Statements of **Maytas Vasishtha Varadhi Limited** ("the Company"), which comprises the Balance Sheet as at March 31 2023, the Statement of Profit and Loss, and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information ("here after referred to as "the Financial Statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid Financial Statements give the information required by the Companies Act 2013 in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015, as amended and other the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31 2023, the loss and total comprehensive income , changes in equity and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

#### Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the Financial Statements in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the *Code of Ethics* issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI 's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### Material uncertainty related to going Concern:

As detailed in Note 8(b)(ii) to the Financial Statements, the Company could not commence the project for which the Company was established and accordingly, has not carried out any operations for a substantial period of time, As at the year end, the Company's net worth is eroded and liabilities are in excess of assets. In view of these factors, the management has drawn up the Financial Statements on the basis of realizable values of assets and liabilities as at the year end.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter

#### Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Director's Report but does not include the Financial Statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the Financial Statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.



In connection with our audit of the Financial Statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the Financial Statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

#### **Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements**

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these Financial Statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance, total comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows of the Company in accordance with The Indian Accounting Standards specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Financial Statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Financial Statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

#### **Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Financial Statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these Financial Statements.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Financial Statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained upto the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Financial Statements, including the disclosures, and whether the Financial Statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.



**1. Corporate Information;**

Maytas Vasishtha Varadhi Limited (the Company) was incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956. The Company is 100% subsidiary of IL&FS Engineering and Construction Company Ltd. The Company has been set up to execute a two lane bridge under BOT on Annuity Basis, for which the Company entered into a Concession Agreement with the Government of Andhra Pradesh, prior to the financial year 2009 – 2010. However, the project for which the Company was incorporated could not be implemented due to termination of the project by the Government of Andhra Pradesh.

**2. Significant Accounting Policies;**

**A. Statement of Compliance:**

The Financial Statements comply in all material aspects with Ind AS notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 and Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2016 as applicable.

Financial statements were authorized for issue by Company's Board of Directors on May 25,2023

**B. Accounting Convention:** The Financial Statements are prepared on realizable value basis.

**C. Use of estimates**

In preparing these standalone financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates

**D. Current & non-current classification**

- iii. Performance Bank guarantees furnished by holding company IL&FS Engineering and Construction Company Limited – Rs. 33,285 to CE (R & B) MD, APRDC, Hyderabad.

**b. Status of the Project and Litigation with GoAP:**

The Company has been set up to execute a Two lane bridge under BOT on Annuity Basis for "Design, construction, finance, operation and maintenance of 2 lane bridge across Vasista, branch of the river Godavari connecting Narsapur of West Godavari District with Sakhinetipalli of East Godavari District under BOT on Annuity Basis" ('the Project'), for which the Company entered into a Concession Agreement with the Government of Andhra Pradesh, prior to the financial year 2009 – 2010. The Holding Company IL&FS Engineering and Construction Company Limited (formerly known as Maytas Infra Ltd ) furnished Performance Bank guarantees for Rs. 33,285.00 to CE (R & B) MD, APRDC, Hyderabad in pursuance of terms of Agreement.

The Government of Andhra Pradesh ('GoAP') had issued a G.O. Rt. No. 319 dated 16.4.2011 for terminating the Agreement and to invoke the Performance Bank Guarantees based on the recommendations made by the Technical Committee appointed by the Government of Andhra Pradesh.

While issuing the said GO, the GoAP did not spell out the reasons for terminating the agreement and invocation of Bank Guarantees, except stating that the GO was passed under the circumstances reported by the Chief Engineer and basing on the recommendations of the Technical Committee.

The Government of Andhra Pradesh did not issue any notice to the Company, nor sought any explanation before terminating the project unilaterally. The Company never expressed its inability to execute the project. As per the terms of Concession Agreement, if any dispute is arisen, either party can invoke Arbitration. Even this course was not exercised by the Government before terminating the contract.

To protect the Bank Guarantees from encashment, the Company had filed Writ Petition No.10913 of 2011 in the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying issue a Writ, Order or Direction, in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the GO Rt.No.319 dated 16.4.2011 issued by the Government of Andhra Pradesh as arbitrary, illegal, violative of principles of natural justice, violative of fundamental rights guaranteed under Constitution of India apart from being violative of the conditions stipulated in the agreement and consequently set aside the same and pass such other order or orders as are deemed fit and proper in the circumstances of the Case.

The Hon'ble High Court passed a stay Order stating that no further steps shall be taken pursuant to the impugned GO till 20.4.2011 vide its Order dated April 19, 2011. The Hon'ble High Court continued such stay and directed to renew BGs till disposal of the Final Orders vide its Orders dated April 20, 2011 until further orders and directed issue of notice to the Respondents to show cause as to why this writ petition should not be admitted in the circumstances set out in the petition and the affidavit filed in Writ Petition.

Both Parties completed the arguments and the matter is posted for judgement. In the meantime, both NCLT/NCLAT orders have been served to the employer to refrain from taking further steps with regard to BG's .

(ii) The Company could not commence the project for which the Company was established and accordingly, has not carried out any operations for the substantial period of time. As at the year end, the Company's net worth is eroded and its liabilities are in excess of assets. In view of these factors, the management has drawn up the financial statements on the basis of realizable value of the assets and liabilities as at the year end.
